The young man thought about Samuel and how he didn't recognize the voice of God, and how little Samuel ran to Eli. "Okay, God, in case that is you, I will buy the milk." He pulled over to the curb and looked around. He was in a semicommercial area of town. It wasn't the best but it wasn't the worst of neighborhoods either. The businesses were closed and most of the houses looked dark like the people were already in bed. Again, he sensed something, "Go and give the milk to the people in the house across the street." The young man looked

at the house. It was dark and it looked like the people were either gone or they were already asleep. He started to open the car door and then sat back in the car seat. "Lord, this is insane. Those people are asleep and if I wake them up, they are going to be mad and I will look stupid." Again, he felt like he should go and give the milk. His wife in the kitchen yelled out, "I asked him to send an Angel with some. Are you an Angel?" The young man reached into his wallet and pulled out all the money he had on him and put in the man's hand. He turned and walked back toward his car and the tears were streaming down his face. He knew that God still answers prayers.

At exactly 12 noon it started snowing and 10 minutes later it was a total whiteout, for several hours... I just got a text that this Friday we are forecasted to get 10 to 15 inches... on top of Mondays 8 inches. I love our Lord, but Mother Nature and the Groundhog have got to go!!!

February was amazing. On the 5th, we had the baptism for Franklin John Fillmore, how very cool was that. Son of John & Alyssa Fillmore and baby brother to Miss Iris. Such a sweet little man and a wonderful young family. But, also on the 5th we had a Chili-Cook-off. I believe 11 different chilis' were present for our

tasting pleasure. The Coveted Golden Ladle went to "Terri Budek" for her white Chili. She raised \$186.00 I believe. But the real winners were the Youth, the cookoff raised \$886.00. Oh yes, also on the afternoon of February 5th, after the Chili-Cook-Off the youth and the chaperones took an afternoon trip to Snow Snake to go snow tubing... Big thanks to our Youth director Jillian and the chaperones who accompanied the youth Lynsey, Brian and Daniel... You make these events possible...

Some youth events you might want to look forward to supporting in some way are, Overnight stays or events at the church, a Corn Hole Tournament, Rummage Sale, Loons games, Trip to Mackinaw Island, walk the Mackinaw Bridge on Labor Day, a Scavenger Hunt, Bowling, Canoeing the Au Sable or local river, Trip to Cedar Point this summer and maybe even a water park. And there will be some work involved as well. Local Mission projects like raking and yard work for our members, helping at the North Midland Center, Soup Kitchens for a day, maybe even help at the East Michigan Food Bank for a day. There is much work to do...

Food Distributions ~ It's no secret that I love feeding people. I have worked nearly 110 Pop-Up-Food pantries in the thumb area prior to coming here last July. I also worked one in February while home between doctor appointments. It has been a goal of mine (and also the Boards desire) to bring this life changing program here to Hope UMC. I am happy to announce that we are almost set up as an agent of the East Michigan Food Bank and we will be announcing very soon the date for our first event. Each event or Pantry requires about 15 to 20 people (volunteers) to operate. Setup will begin at 9 am when the truck arrives, the Giveaway runs two hours 10 unil 12 noon. I plan to give any left overs to the North Midland Center to finish distributing. Every distribution serves approximately 250 families. What a blessing as we pass out \$35,000 to \$45,000 of food in just 120 minutes... Clean-up takes a bit to stack pallets and get rid of Cardboard from the many boxes. Each truck costs \$1,200.00 but, in my recent calls to the Food Bank, they are currently distributing trucks at No cost in our area. We want to take advantage of this while it lasts. With the free truck availability this could be a monthly event while the grant lasts. More information to come! Confirmation and Membership Classes ~ Another huge blessing, we currently have 5 students and 4 Adults, I believe, in the process of membership classes. Because the classes are virtually the same, I am running them together. 1^{st} Class ~ March 5^{th} ~ 6 pm Hope UMC we will discuss Church History. 2^{nd} Class ~ March 19^{th} ~ 6pm Hope UMC ~ what defines the Methodist Church. 3rd Class ~ March 26th ~ 6pm Hope UMC ~ How do you live out this calling? What do you expect? How will life change?

There will be plenty of time for questions and we will be done at 7pm each night.

The remaining question is, when will we receive these new members into the Hope

United Methodist Church. 1. Palm Sunday 4/2/23 Communion Sunday.

All must be able to attend. 2. Easter Sunday 4/9/23 very festive...

Your Best Lent Ever "Journey to the Cross" ~ we passed out booklets at church on Sunday 2/25/23 and ran out, but more will be available this coming Sunday 3/5/23.
